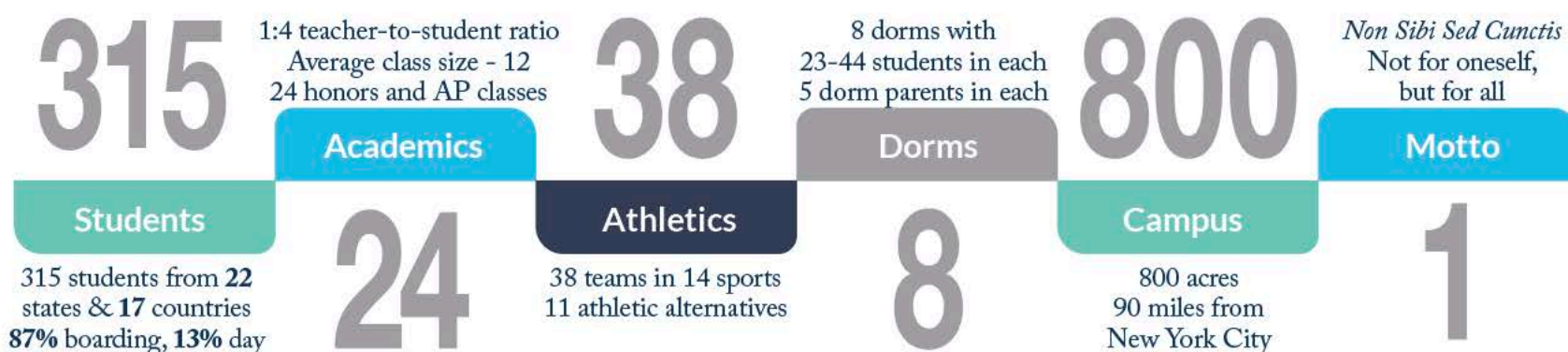


MILLBROOK

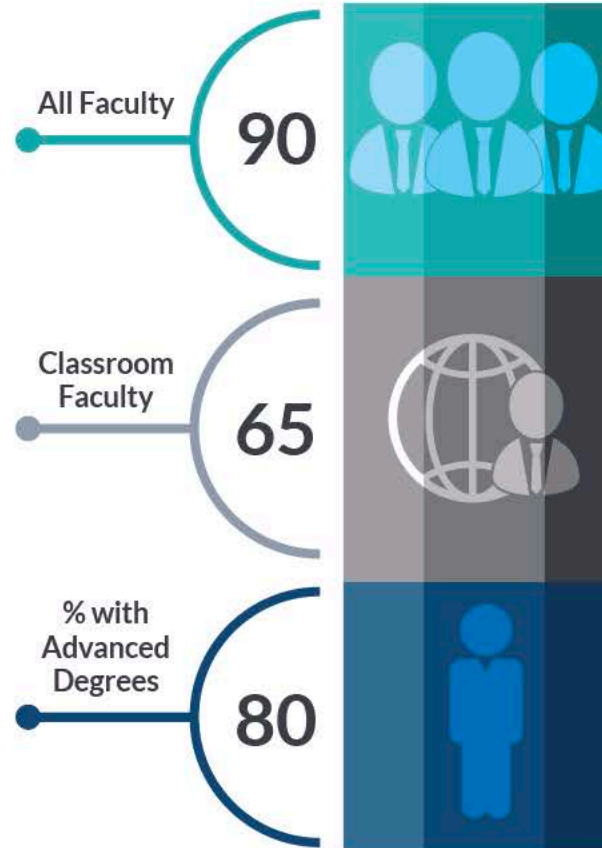

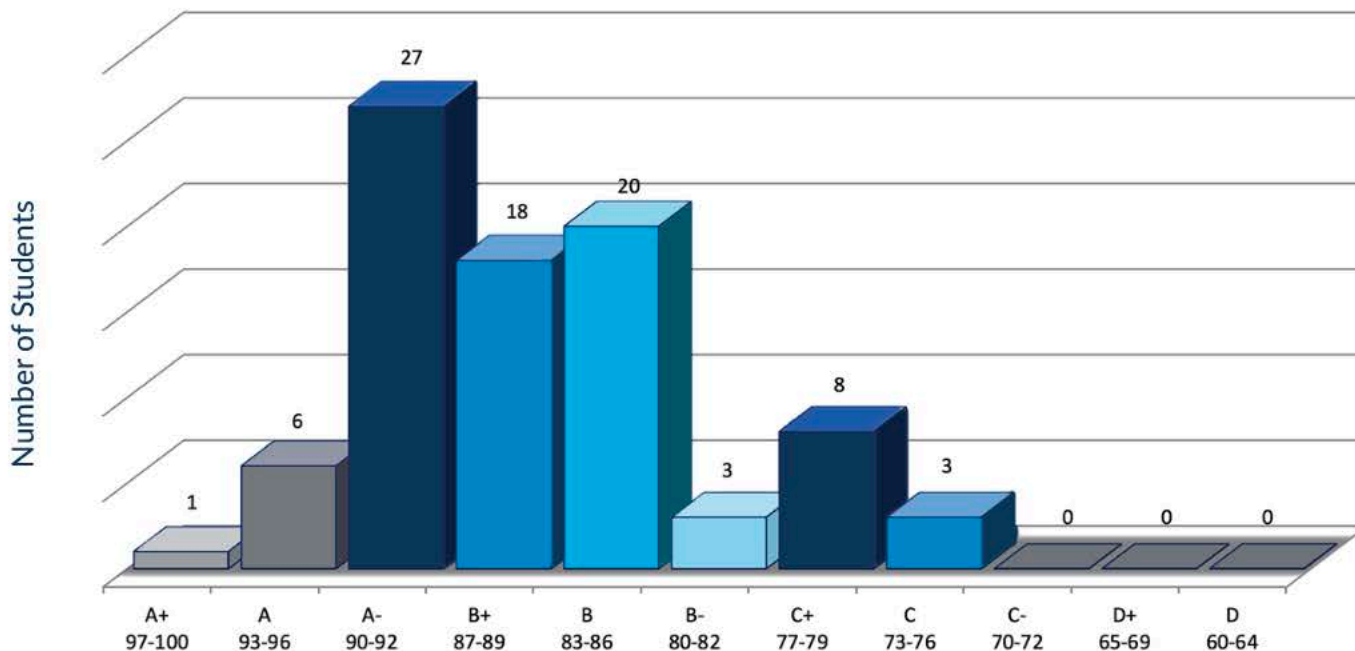

NOTABLE PROGRAMS & FACILITIES

THE TREVOR ZOO

Within Millbrook's 800 acres of rolling hills, forests, wetlands, playing fields, trails, and the campus proper sits our six-acre Trevor Zoo, a facility fully accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums. Here, we breed endangered species, eight altogether, and our students are involved in their daily care. The zoo provides a bounty of opportunity for students to research, test hypotheses, and learn more here about biology, animal behavior, and environmental science than they could learn at any other school in the world.

CES

All seniors at Millbrook are required to complete a Culminating Experience during their senior year. The purpose of this program is to provide our seniors with an opportunity to develop their intellectual independence in a particular discipline or disciplines by engaging in an authentic intellectual project as part of the culmination of their academic career at Millbrook. Seniors are required to present their findings in a formal presentation to members of the Millbrook community.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAM

Beyond the demands that it makes on its students in academics and athletics, Millbrook also asks that each student take on some particular responsibility for the daily functioning of the school. Through the Community Service Program students maintain and operate the Trevor Zoo, recycling center, school store, library, science labs, arts center, garden, outreach, post office, activities program, and other programs central to the school's operation.

MILLBROOK ENGAGE

Non sibi sed cunctis (Not for oneself, but for all), is not just the school motto appearing on our letterhead; it is the way life at Millbrook every day. As an extension of the current community service activities on campus, an alumnus has helped us create an endowed internship program for rising VIth form students. Selected students work over the summer for approved not-for-profit organizations or other identified causes where the students' involvement has tangible value. In the fall students share their experiences, and the lessons learned, with the Millbrook School community in forums and chapel talks.

CANOPY WALKWAY, BOARDWALK & SOLAR FIELD

The outdoor learning spaces on Millbrook's 800-acre campus are incredible, and here, students engage in scientific lessons from the ground to the treetops. Whether it be collecting specimens in the wetlands, making observations in the canopy walkway as part of an ecology course, or integrating the solar field into an advanced physics lesson, science is truly hands-on, and the learning opportunities are truly unique. Our outdoor learning spaces are truly an extension of our classrooms.

SEMESTER PROGRAMS & SCHOOL YEAR ABROAD

Millbrook School students have the opportunity to attend special academic semester-long programs such as The Chewonki Semester School in Maine, The High Mountain Institute in Colorado, The Island School in the Bahamas, The Mountain School in Vermont, or The School for Ethics and Global Leadership in Washington, D.C. Alternatively, students can study abroad for an entire school year through the School Year Abroad program in China, France, Spain, or Italy.
