Community

The Church Farm School (CFS), founded in 1918, is a college preparatory, independent, boarding and day school for boys in grades 9 through 12. Located in beautiful central Chester County, PA, the school is a member of the National Association of Episcopal Schools and the National Association of Independent Schools. Our school is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. Originally established to serve the needs of boys from single-parent homes, it is now the mission of CFS to "provide a rigorous, well-rounded, collegepreparatory education in a Christian, caring environment that will best prepare our students for productive and fulfilling lives."

School

CFS has an enrollment of 160 students in grades 9 through 12, with a group of 44 seniors expected to graduate in May 2021. We are committed to diversity at CFS, and minority and international students make up more than half of the student body.

The overwhelming majority of CFS graduates go on to four-year colleges and universities for further study. There are 33 members of the teaching faculty, most of whom hold advanced degrees. Our student-faculty ratio is 5:1.

Curriculum & Academics

All courses meet for 70-minute periods, three times a week. Our goal is to allow time for more intensive and project-based class work, and introduce students to a schedule similar to what they will experience in college. CFS follows an A/B week schedule rotation, with each class meeting at different times on different days. This ensures that all classes are equally impacted by late arrivals, early athletic dismissals and other events.

Minimum graduation requirements at CFS include 22 credits, distributed as follows:
English (4), mathematics (3), social studies (4), laboratory science (3), modern foreign language (2), visual and performing arts (1), world religions (0.5), health (0.5) and electives (4). Most students complete additional credits, especially in math, science and language.

Seven (7) Advanced Placement courses are offered: Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Biology*, Chemistry, English** (Language & Composition), Spanish* and U.S. History. We are developing a series of advanced courses of our own, which will replace AP classes. We currently offer six elective courses in the humanities each semester, which incorporate college-level research, writing and discussion.

Five (5) Honors courses are currently offered: Algebra II, Pre-calculus, English 10 (American Literature), History 10 (Modern Global) and Spanish III. *AP Biology and AP Spanish Language will not be offered during the 2020-2021 school year due to low enrollment.

**In 2019-2020 we offered Advanced English Language. The course followed the AP English Language syllabus and students were prepared to sit for the AP English Language Exam.

Students qualify for AP and/or Honors courses using the following criteria:

- · Overall GPA of at least 87
- · Minimum average of 92 in a regular course in that subject areas. Students already in AP/Honors courses must have at least an 87 average to continue to the next level
- · Recommendation from current teacher
- · Approval by department chair
- · Courses are limited in enrollment with the most qualified students having first priority
- Students taking more than two AP/Honors courses must have approval from the Director of Academics

CFS distributes grades four times per year. Grades are given to recognize both achievement and effort.

The Academic Honor Roll is announced four times per year and is achieved by earning a marking period average of 92 or above, with no grade below an 83. CFS continues to be an active member of the National Honor Society.

GPA

The GPA is calculated beginning in ninth grade with all subjects factored. Courses taken at schools other than CFS are not used in computing the GPA. All courses are averaged in the GPA. We no longer offer a weighted GPA. This is a change for the 2020-21 school year from prior years, where we were on a 4.3 scale and provided a weighted GPA.

Rank

CFS does not rank students.

Additional Requirements

In addition to academics, CFS students are required to participate in athletics, community service activities, outdoor educational experiences and leadership development.

Athletically, CFS is a member of the Bicentennial Athletic League (PIAA) and fields competitive programs in soccer, cross-country, golf, basketball, wrestling, bowling, winter and spring track, tennis, lacrosse and baseball. Physical Education is through our afterschool sports program and a ¼ credit is earned each semester, but not placed on the transcript.

All juniors participate in college planning seminars during the spring semester, and all seniors participate in a seminar series focused on the transition to college during their final semester.

Alumni Success Program

The Alumni Success Program was created in 2016 to increase the percentage of Church Farm School students who graduate from a four-year college within six years. CFS staff contact students in college via text, email, phone and personal visits to assure alumni academic persistence and completion at the college level. Initial results of this program reflect a substantially increased persistence rate in college for our graduates.

The Class of 2020 had 92 percent of graduates attending a four-year college or university. Eight percent of graduates attended a two-year college.

Covid-19 Addendum

On March 6, 2020, Church Farm School left for spring break and did not return to campus for the rest of the school year. The second half of our spring semester was completely remote, and without athletics, clubs, activities, etc. CFS moved to a virtual school platform using Zoom meetings. Classes met twice a week for one hour, Monday-Friday. We did not change our grading system during that time. All students received numerical grades for their classes.

For the first semester of 2020, we opted to open remotely. Students can participate virtually on campus or at home. We will not be offering an interscholastic fall sports season due to local regulations. We hope to resume in-person learning for our second semester in February of 2021. We will continue to provide numerical grades for students.
