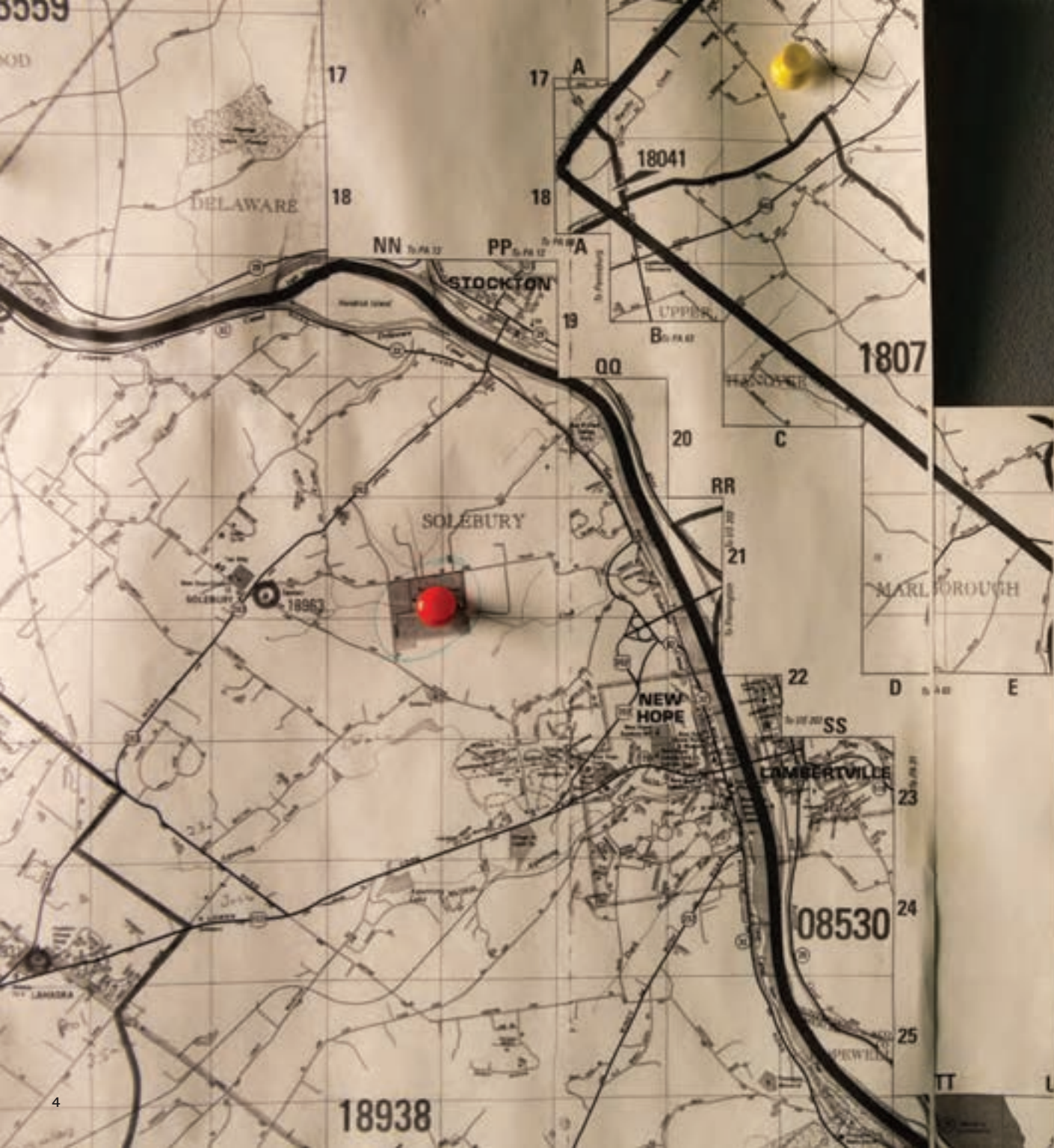

Nestled in the rolling hills of historic Bucks County, Pennsylvania, Solebury School's village-like campus offers both easy access to the wider world and opportunities to enjoy its idyllic natural setting. Solebury's 140 acres include meadows and woodlands, a meandering stream, and a pond. The Delaware River and the lively village of New Hope are just minutes away, and New York and Philadelphia are within easy reach.

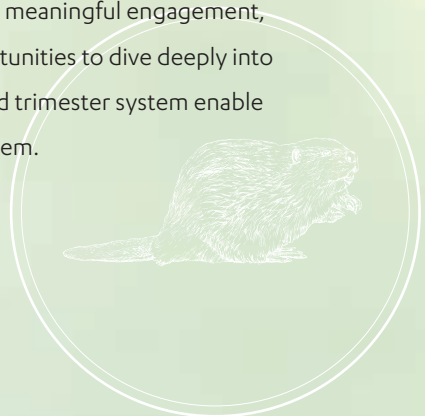

Hone printmaking techniques, meet master printmakers, and create a portfolio.

#### INTERNATIONAL HORROR LITERATURE

Learn how a country or region's history influences their contribution to the genre.

#### CIVIL RIGHTS TO BLACK POWER

Dig deeply into a variety of sources to understand the origin and impact of these key movements.

#### MORAL CONFLICTS

Challenging moral issues around the globe, team-taught by a history teacher and a science teacher.

#### SUSTAINABILITY

Approach this complex topic at the local, national, and global level and develop an in-depth understanding of the challenges and possible solutions.

#### HONORS SOCIAL THEORY

Ideas from psychology, sociology, culture studies, and history that have shaped the study of society in the last century.

#### AP CALCULUS BC

Includes all of the topics covered in AB, plus topics typically covered in college-level Calculus II.

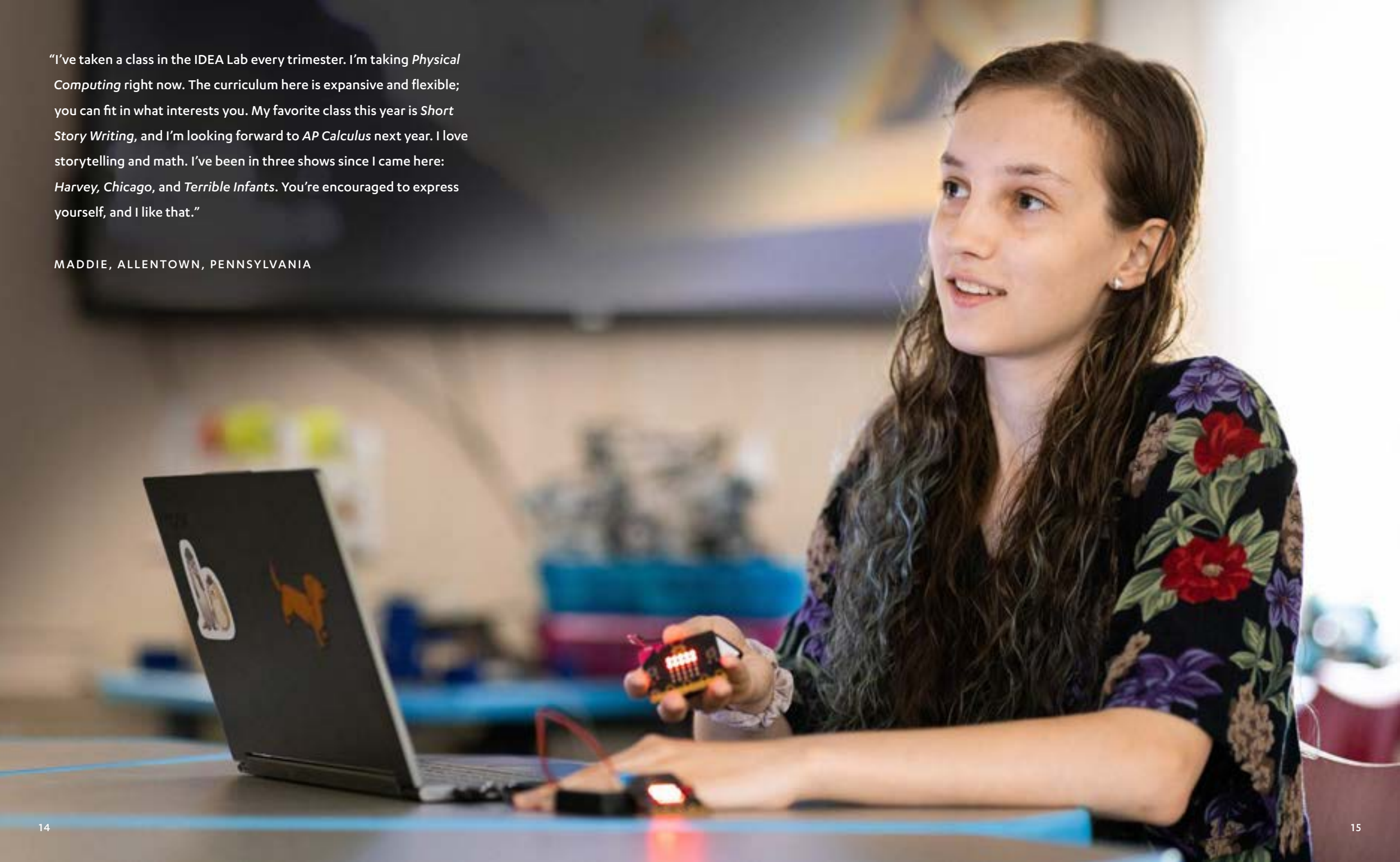

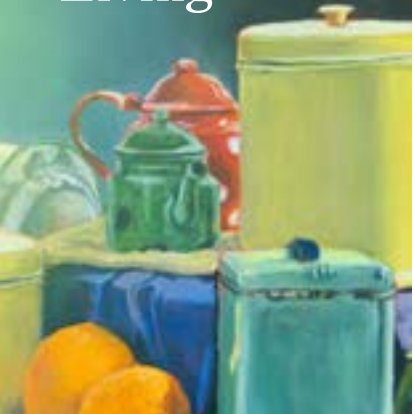
## CULTIVATE

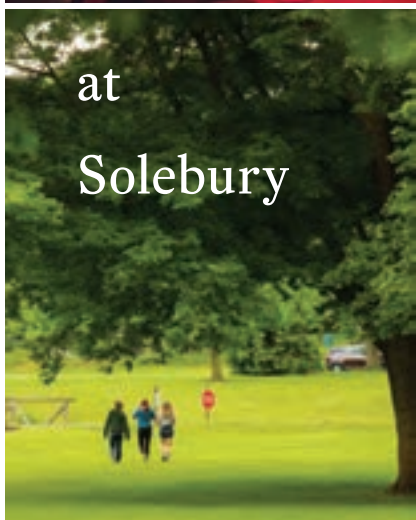

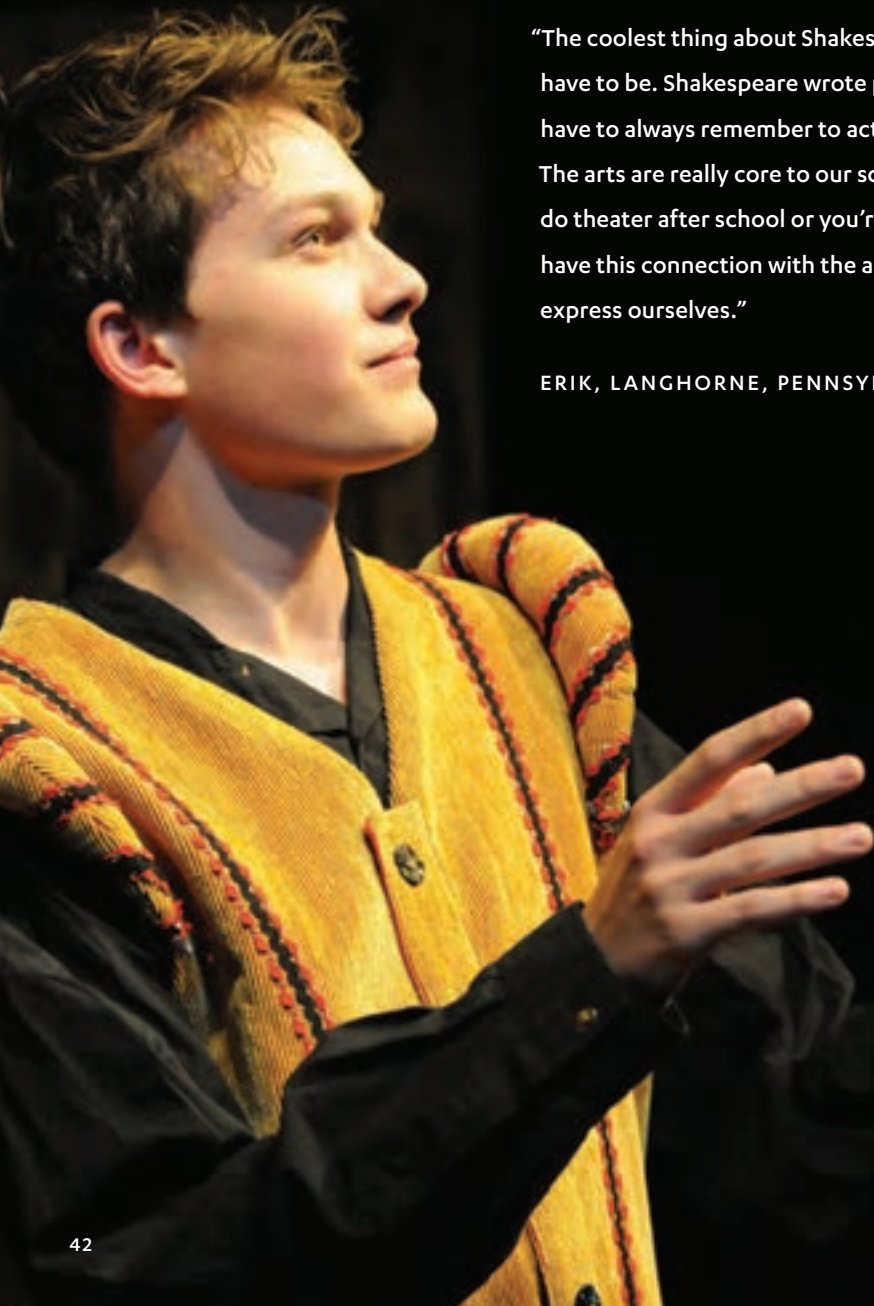




## Students of all kinds thrive in Solebury's ever-present live music and arts scene.

Getting involved is only a drumbeat away. One of every five students is involved in theater, from performing on stage to building sets or tech. Rock Band concerts and coffee houses bring everyone together. Students can choose from 57 art electives, and Arts Week highlights student work and brings local and national artists to campus for a week of performances, workshops, and talks.
